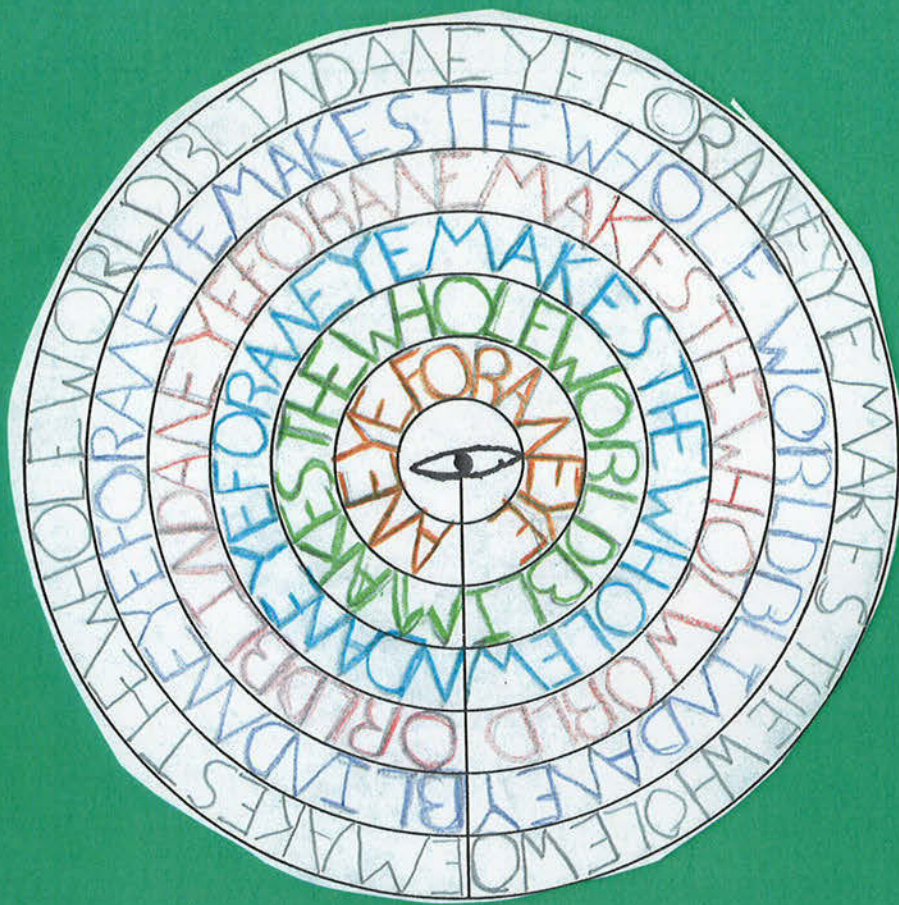
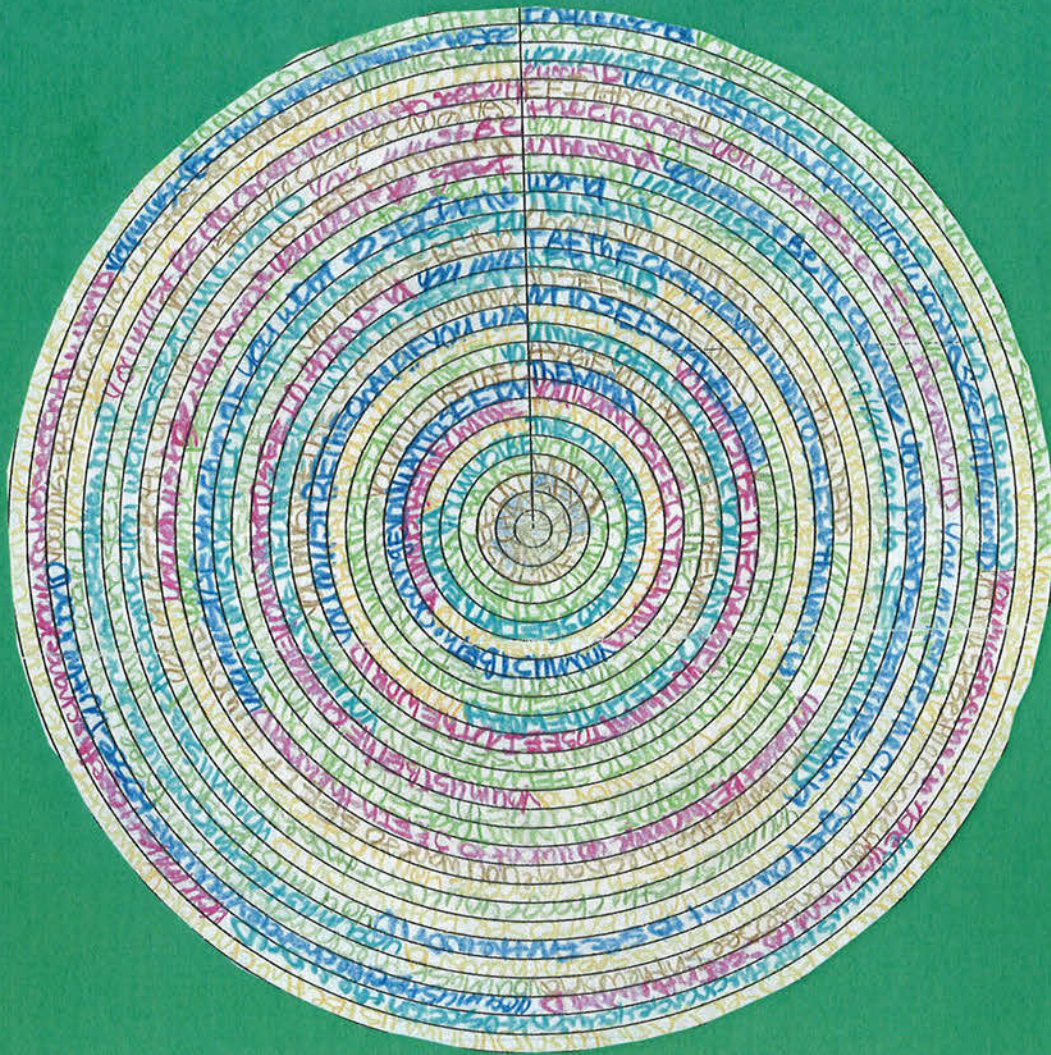

World change

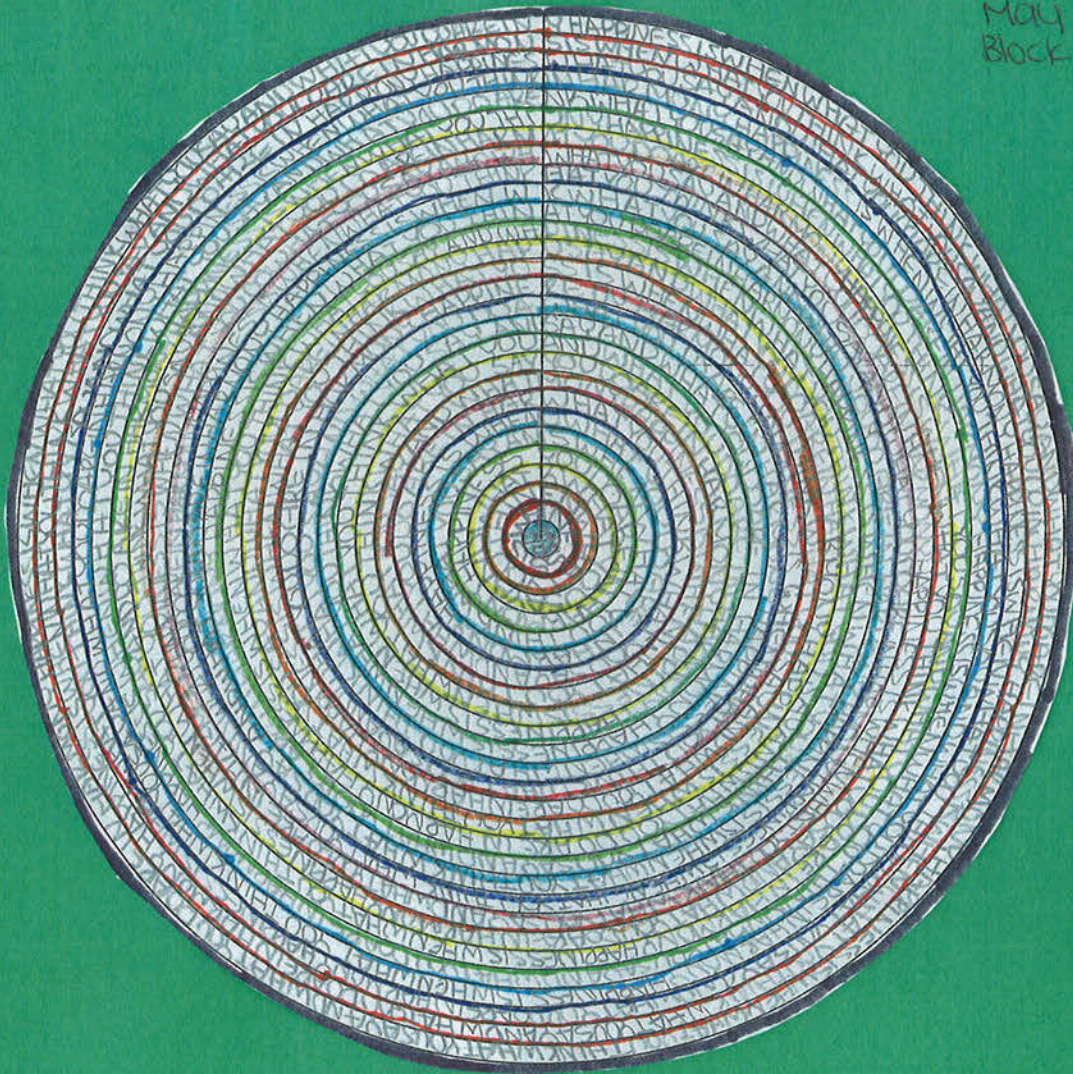

Give Me Freedom, or Give Me Death

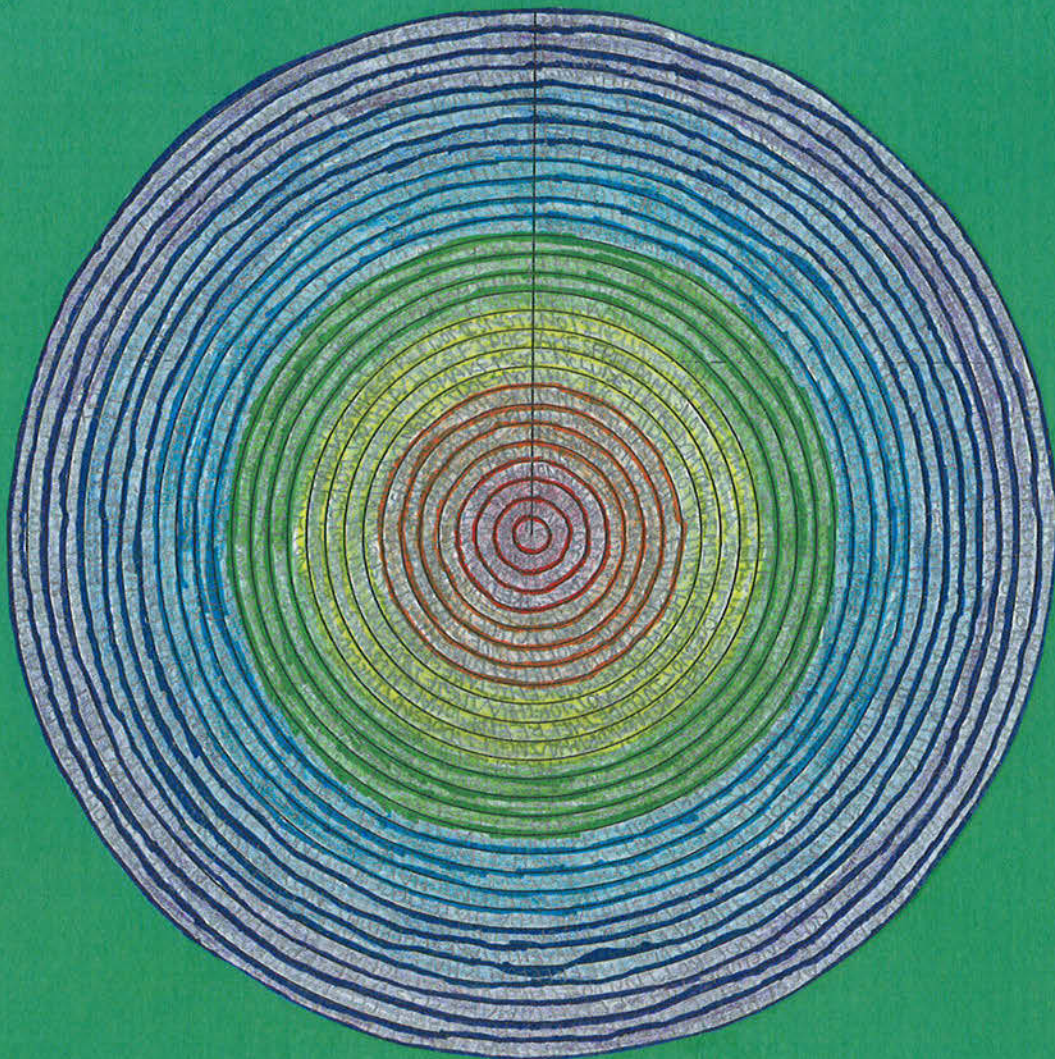

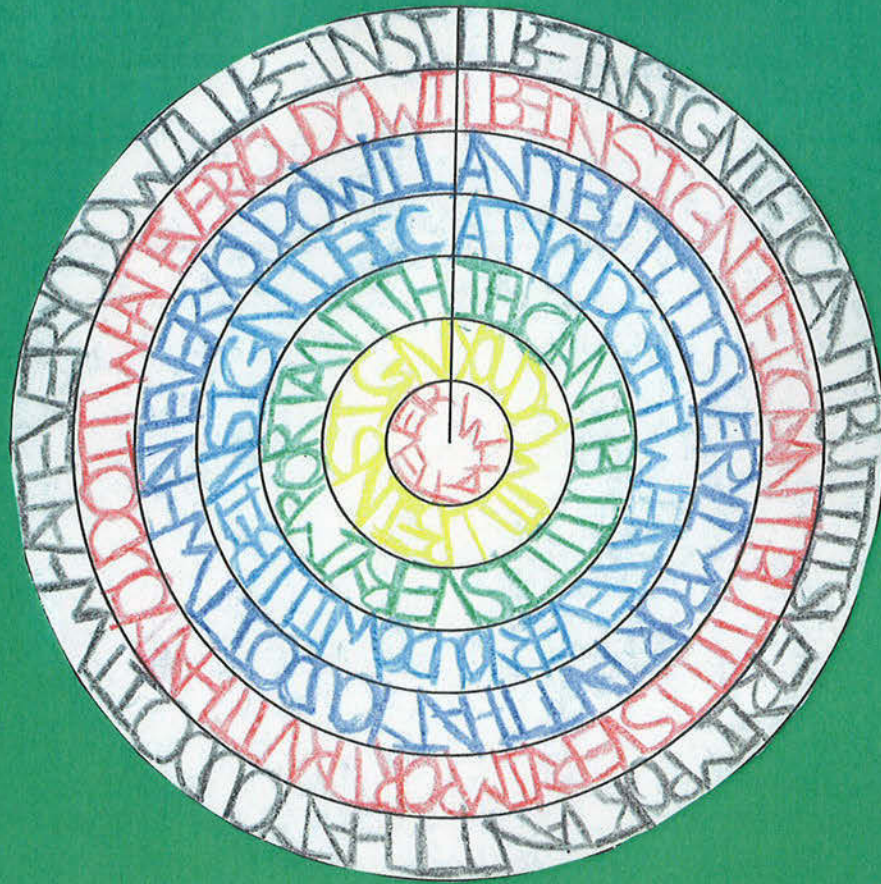

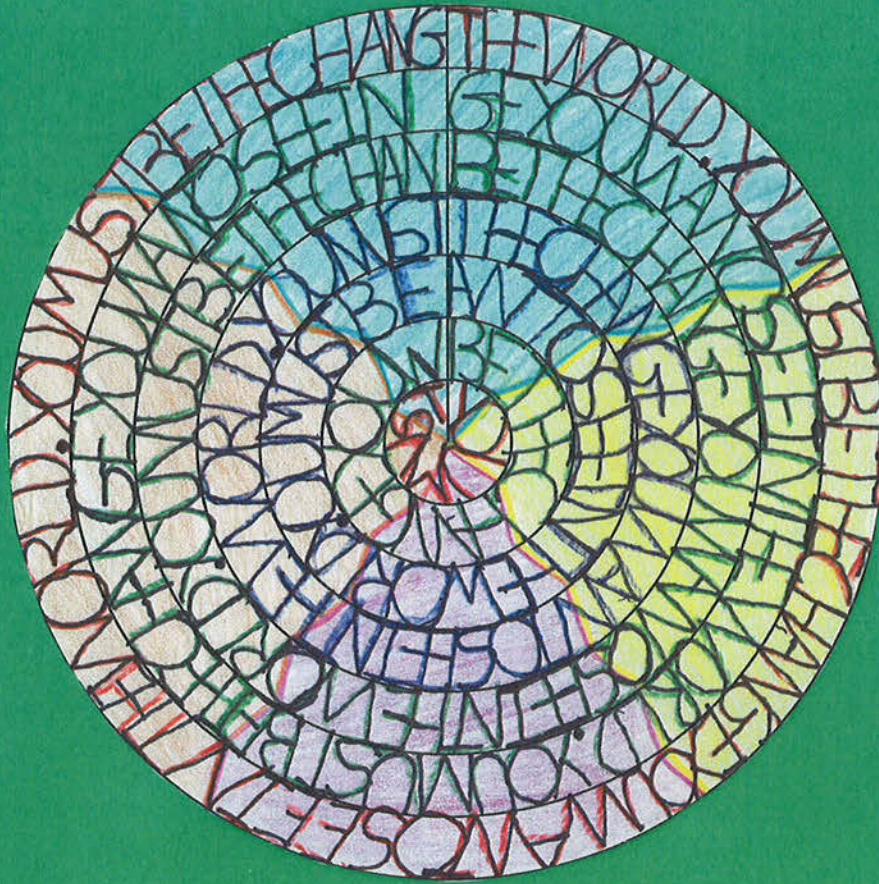


The Civil Wars

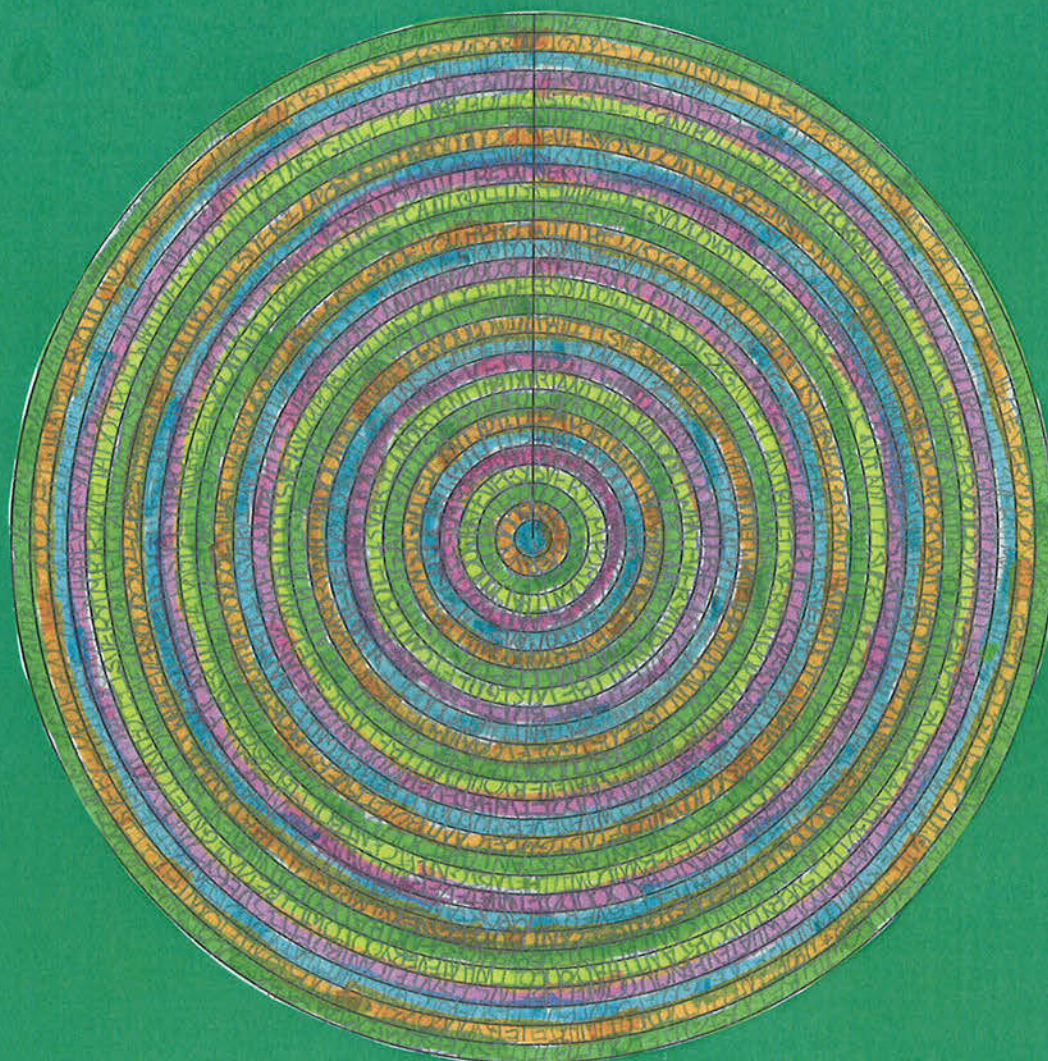

Insignificant, Yet Important

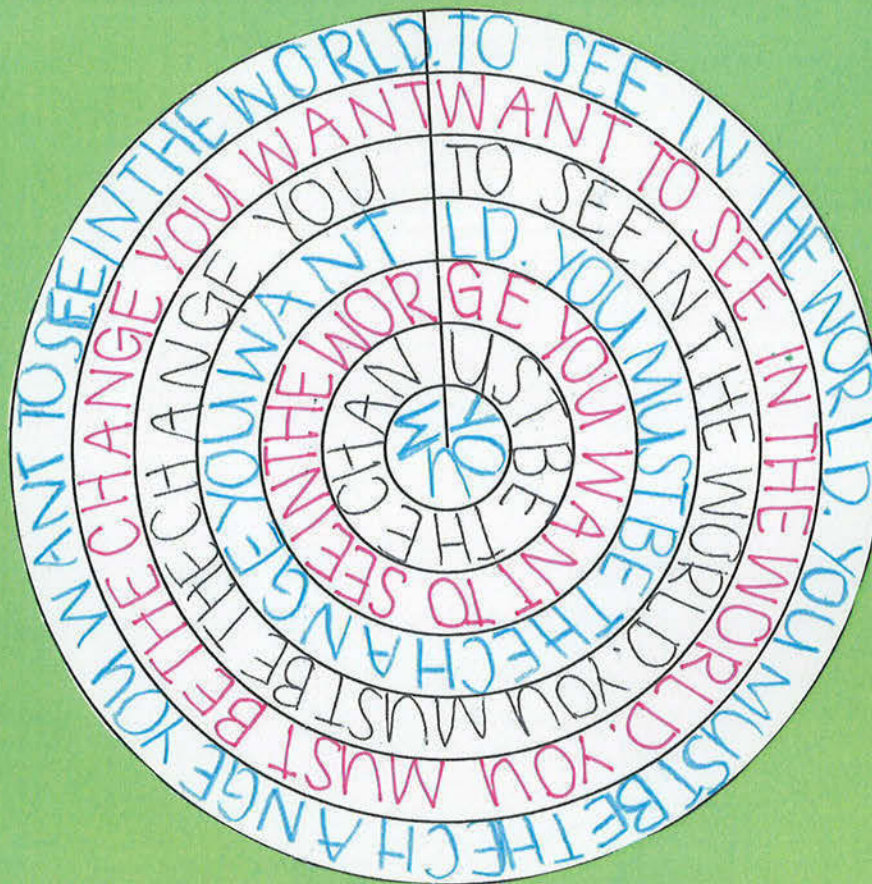
